

Aktion Club, Builders Club and K Kids. Reaching out to other groups who are excited to help serve the community. A great way to expand service in your area.







# District Service Project



Having experienced a year of chemotherapy and five surgeries in the past year and a half, Roger and I have great empathy for young children with cancer. Therefore, we have chosen Jarrett's Joy Cart for the district project this year. Please bring your donation to the district convention in Kingsport, TN. Thanks, Carolyn Blair

Jarrett Mynear was a very special 13-year-old boy who lived in the central Kentucky community of Nicholasville with his mom, Jennifer, his dad, Doug, and younger sister, Claire. He was interested in those things enjoyed by kids his age – playing with friends, video games, swimming and going on vacation.

The thing that made Jarrett a little different from most kids was that he was diagnosed with cancer six times from two years old until he succumbed to the disease at age 13. As a result of his treatment and rehabilitation, Jarrett spent a lot of time in hospitals receiving chemotherapy, two bone marrow transplants and the amputation of his lower right leg. His treatments were administered at various medical institutions including the Mayo Clinic, the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, the Kentucky Children's Hospital and the National Institutes of Health.

When first diagnosed, a family friend told Doug and Jennifer to "look for the good in this bad situation." Though that statement may seem a little odd, Doug and Jennifer discovered a number of special friends that the family met from across the country. It was because of these friends and Jarrett's compassion for others that Jarrett decided to start Jarrett's Joy Cart.

As a patient himself, Jarrett knew that being in the hospital is scary and lonely. He also realized the importance of knowing that someone else was thinking about you as well. Jarrett's goal in starting the Joy Cart was to bring excitement and joy into every child's hospital stay.

Jarrett's Joy Cart was a dream of a boy only 9 years old to help bring joy to other children. The Joy Cart is a charitable program that implements the virtues of compassion and kindness by delivering toys, cheer and hope to children in crisis situations, particularly those at KY Children's Hospital. While Jarrett is no longer with us, his ideals, goals and most importantly, his joy remains in the work of the Joy Cart at KY Children's Hospital and other outreach projects nationwide. With your help and through the efforts of family and our wonderful volunteers, Jarrett's Joy Cart will be able to continue his mission. "It doesn't matter what you do to help others, just do something..." Jarrett Mynear

Jarrett's Joy Cart began in Lexington, Kentucky, at Kentucky Children's Hospital, which serves children from across the state. Today, this mission is directed by his parents, Jennifer and Doug Mynear, and continues with the help of many dedicated volunteers.

# Maternal/Neonatal Tetanus (MNT)

# What is MNT?

In 25 countries around the world, maternal and neonatal tetanus (MNT) can quickly turn the joy of childbirth into tragedy. MNT kills one baby every nine minutes. Its effects are excruciating — tiny newborns suffer repeated, painful convulsions and extreme sensitivity to light and touch. There is little hope of survival. And tetanus kills mothers too.



## Who suffers from MNT?

MNT is caused when tetanus spores, found in soil everywhere, come into contact with open cuts during childbirth. The disease strikes the poorest of the poor, the geographically hard to reach and those without health care.

# Can MNT be stopped?

Yes! MNT is highly preventable. Just three doses of a 60-cent immunization protect mothers, who then pass on the immunity to their future babies. Together, Kiwanis and UNICEF can stop this disease.

# Why hasn't MNT been eliminated already?

UNICEF has helped to successfully eliminate MNT in many countries. But in 25 countries in Africa, Asia, Europe and North America, it still strikes babies and mothers who have little or no access to health care — either because they are poor, live in remote areas or are caught in humanitarian emergencies. More funds and resources are needed to reach all babies and mothers at risk.

# What will it take to eliminate MNT from the Earth?

More than 100 million mothers and their future babies must be immunized. This requires vaccines, syringes, safe storage, transportation, thousands of skilled staff and more. It will take US\$110 million — and the dedicated work of UNICEF and every member of the Kiwanis family.

# Why focus on this issue?

It is unacceptable that innocent newborns and their mothers suffer and die from MNT when it can be prevented so easily. This is also an amazing opportunity to reach the poorest, most neglected mothers and babies with lifesaving health care. Developing delivery systems for MNT vaccines will blaze a trail to provide additional desperately needed services to these marginalized families.

# What is the Eliminate partnership?

Hand in hand, Kiwanis and UNICEF will eliminate MNT and change the world. Kiwanis' commitment, vision and strength in reaching communities and leaders will help wipe out this cruel, centuries-old disease and pave the way for other interventions. UNICEF has staff working in the most isolated corners of the globe and an unbeatable supply chain.
