 All others: 4 members
 For all categories, any one of the following CURRENT office-holders may be counted as a "member": any International Officer or any of the following from the K-T District: the Governor, (C.D. Reese), the Secretary (Fran Marion), any District Committee Chair, any Lt. Governor. Refer to your District Directory and Guidebook (p. 39) for additional information.
